It is the responsibility of the Head of Establishment / Visit Leader to prepare a Risk Assessment for a visit that recognises these general hazards but also provides adequate details of the hazards and control measures of their specific undertaking. Local Authorities / other organisations may require Visit Leaders to complete their own specific risk assessment template e.g., one that uses a scoring system that provides a quantifiable measure of the risk. The generic information below sets out general hazards and control measures, which can be adapted and used with any template – the information can be used either as a standalone risk assessment for the adventure activity element of a visit or integrated into the risk assessment for a whole visit.
